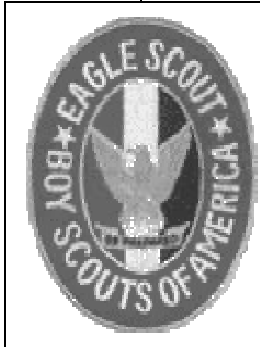
In order to keep

The entire interior of the stone structure will become eating area. The porches will be closed in and create additional dining area. The old windows will be removed from the stone walls to open the interior. Finally, a new combination kitchen-commissary will be built where the current commissary stands.

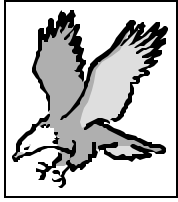
